  - ◆ Squeeze sb in: give us an appointment, even though your schedule is tight
- 4. They thrive on conflict.
  - ♦ *Thrive on conflict*: they have better lives while confronting a problem
- 5. I'm posing a question.
  - pose a question:
     to ask a question, especially one that needs to be carefully thought about
- 6. Hold that thought
  - ♦ Hold the thought: don't forget ur idea, it's gonna be useful one day
- 7. You scaring the crap out of me
- 8. I just got caught up in all of this
  - ♦ I'm completely involve in this
- 9. You've been out for four months
  - ♦ be out=be in a coma
- 10.It's okay to eat your feelings
  - Eating your feelings means not talking about them
- 11. It's completely demeaning.
  - Demeaning=showing less respect for someone than they deserve, or making someone feel embarrassed or ashamed
- 12. You never know who's lurking around the corner.
  - ◆ *Lurk*= lie in wait, lie in ambush, behave in a sneaky and secretive manner
- 13. He raved about your book.
  - ♠ Rave= praise enthusiastically

- 14. You don't need to twist my arm.
  - twist my arm=put me under pressure to do sth, persuade me to do sth

#### 15.It takes one to know one.

◆ The person who expressed criticism has similar faults to the person being criticized.

A near equivalent is the proverbial "it takes a thief to catch a thief ", meaning "no one is better at finding a wrongdoer than another wrongdoer."

### 16. I'll just *get out of your hair* now.

I'm gonna stop annoying you

17. And if you like top-of-the-line, wait till you see the...

- ◆ Top of the line=of the best quality or among the most expensive of its kind 18.I'm mooching off a mooch!
  - saying humorously

**Mooch** (noun) = so who tries to get something free

**To mooch sth of sb**= to get something by asking someone to give you it, instead of paying for it

19. Ever since the ..., you've been hovering over me.

 Hover over sb/sth: Figurative meaning to stay close to someone or something, waiting, ready to advise or interfere

EX:

Please don't hover over me, watching what I am doing.

I have to hover over this project or someone will mess it up.

# 20.you've always had a thing for X

♦ have a thing for sth =to like or dislike something or someone very much

## 21. Hate to be a stickler, but ...

- ◆ Stickler=one who insists on exactness or completeness in the observance of something
- 22.I'll give you \$5,000 for her sight unseen.
  - I will pay \$5000 without seeing her

*sight unseen*= without been seen in advance

23. These women that you *take such pleasure in deriding*, they work their asses off.

They literally get on their hands and knees for you.

◆ Deride= to speak of or treat with contempt, mockery, or ridicule

24. In fact, I have an idea that I'd love to run by you

◆ run by you =to explain/show sth to you to get your opinion, Let me run this idea by you and see what you think of it

## Idioms, slangs and expressions used in the series

- 1. If you can't provide your whereabouts, I'll have to take you down to the station.
  - ♦ Whereabouts= location
- 2. I got in off the wait list.
  - ♦ Off the wait list
- 3. I hope you don't mind me popping by like this.
  - ◆ Pop by/in/around (for a visit) :

to come by [someone's residence] for a visit.

EX:You simply must pop around for a visit sometime.

I will pop by about noon.

I can pop in for only a minute.

- 4. I doubt you'd get ahold of him
- 5. It is about ceding control
  - ◆ Cede control= give over/lose control

Why would I subject myself to that?

subject sb/sth to sth (phrasal verb ):
 to make someone or something experience an unpleasant or worrying thing

- 6. Just give it a whirl
  - give sth a whirl (informal):

to try something that you are not sure you are going to like or be able to do

EX: Why don't you give golf a whirl?

- 7. What if I sweeten the deal with an obscenely large diamond?
- 8. The job market is really slow, Nobody is hiring.
- 9. It's a pigsty!
  - ♦ Pigsty=a very dirty or untidy place
- 10. We're canvassing the neighborhood for leads on a case.
  - ◆ to canvass: to ask people about something in order to get their opinion or to get information

EX : Police canvassed the neighborhood, but didn't find any witnesses.

- 11. I hope you got your tetanus shot.
  - tetanus shot : واكسن كزاز
- 12. Helps him keep his mind off of X.
  - ◆ take/keep/get sb's mind off sth: to make someone stop thinking and worrying about something
- 13. She takes forever
  - ◆ *Sth/sb take forever* = to take much more time than you would like
- 14.she's just full of it
  - ♦ be full of it = not polite a rude expression used to say that someone often says things that are wrong or stupid
- 15. Until then, I'll just keep crashing here
  - ◆ *Crash a place*: to sleep /stay at someone elses house for the night
- 16.Let's just get this over with
  - ◆ Get sth over with: do or finish a job especially an unpleasant or unwanted one
- 17. What strikes your fancy, darling?

- to strike somebody's fancy = catch/tickle your fancy :
   to seem interesting or pleasing to someone
   EX: She has enough money to buy whatever strikes her fancy
- 18. Sometimes a problem is just an opportunity in disguise

- 1. It's a celebration of your lifelong commitment.
- 2. But nothing over the top, I promise
  - ◆ Over The Top= OTT (BrE informal)=

OTT= remarks, behaviour etc that are so extreme or unreasonable that they seem stupid or offensive

- 3. It's very sweet of you to be concerned
- 4. I am at my wits' end with this maid you sent me.
  - ♦ be at your wits' end =to be very upset and not know what to do, because you have tried everything possible to solve a problem
- 5. I should not be having to make endless chitchat with my maid
- 6. I will talk to her and tell her no more pesky questions
  - ♦ Pesky= annoying
- 7. I'm trying to get over you
  - ♦ *Get over sb* = forget sb
- 8. we're going to have a sparkling repartee
  - ♦ *Repartee*=adroitness and cleverness in reply
  - ◆ A conversation which is fast and full of intelligent and amusing remarks and replies
- 9. Has she broken your spirit yet? ... Well, give it time!
- 10. Knock it off
  - ♦ Knock it off = stop it, quit it, don't do that anymore

- 11. He is in escrow on a "suicide condo
  - ◆ *Escrew*= money, property, or a legal document that is kept by someone until a particular thing has happened
- 12. I threw you into the deep end with that.
  - ♦ jump/be thrown in at the deep end= to choose to do or be made to do a very difficult job without having prepared for it

EX: She decided to jump in at the deep end, buy a farm, and teach herself.

### 13. you scratch my back, I'll scratch yours

♦ MEANS you will help someone if they agree to help you

#### 14. I'll bet

- ♦ used to show that you do not believe what someone has just told you
- 15. Her crab cakes are to die for
  - ◆ "to die for" (adj) = extremely good or desirable used humorously-
- 16. I have a bone to pick with you
  - ♦ have a bone to pick with sb (spoken): used to tell someone that you are annoyed with them and want to talk about it
- 17. I was gonna badmouth your business all over the town
- 18. Feels good to get that off my chest
  - ◆ get sth off your chest: to tell someone about something that has been worrying or annoying you for a long time, so that you feel better afterwards
- 19. It's been eating away at me
  - ◆ Eat away at sb/sth=to make someone feel very worried over a long period of time

EX: The thought of mother alone like that was eating away at her

- 1. You may be a lot of things, *cranky*, bossy, ...
  - **♦** *Cranky*=Weird/eccentric
- 2. Friends stick together through thick and thin.
  - ◆ through thick and thin =in spite of any difficulties or problems EX:Then, families stuck together through thick and thin .
- 3. I can take you out to dinner, and we can talk things over.
  - ♦ talk over [talk sth ⇔over] phr v =
    to discuss a problem with someone before deciding what to do
- 4. He is a gem, an absolute professional
  - ♦ *Gem*= a very helpful or special person
- 5. hammered
  - ♦ *hammered*= very drunk
- 6. let's make a pact,
  - ◆ Pact =a formal agreement between two groups, countries, or people, especially to help each other or to stop fighting
  - ♦ Make/sign a pact
- 7. Did Mommy *have a friend over* while I was away?
  - have someone over: if you have someone over, they come to yourhouse to visit you or to stay with you

EX: We're having the Simpsons over for dinner on Tuesday evening.

- 8. I didn't *sleep a wink* last night.
- 9. This happens *from time to time*.
- 10. It's the only thing that'll work out my kinks
  - ♦ *Kink*= a painful muscle spasm especially in the neck or back
- 11. I'm *in agony*.

- 12. Don't act like this is in my head.
- 13. I know things have been strained between us, but ...
  - **♦** *Strained*=tense
- 14. You are tampering with evidence.
  - ◆ Tamper with: to touch something or make changes to it without permission, especially in order to deliberately damage it

EX: He noticed that the instruments had been tampered with.

- 15. you tried to pawn it off on her
  - ◆ pawn off [pawn sth⇔off] phr v
  - ♦ pawn something ⇔off on

=(informal) to persuade someone to buy or accept something that you want to get rid of, especially something of low quality

EX: Don't let him pawn off an old bike on you - get a new one

- 16. I don't understand why you women lap it up
  - lap up [lap sth⇔up] phr v
     =to enjoy something without worrying about whether it is good, true
- 17. Now I'm being wooed by a surgeon, and it's killing you
  - ♦ Woo:
    - to try to persuade someone to do something such as buy something from you, vote for you, or work for you used in news reports
    - to try to persuade a woman to love you and marry you
- 18. I heard about Blanca leaving you in the lurch
  - ◆ leave sb in the lurch = to leave someone at a time when you should stay and help them
- 19. A spokesperson said the police are **zeroing in on** a suspect
  - ★ zero in on / [zero in on sb/sth] phr v = home in on
     to direct all your attention towards a particular person or thing
     EX:She immediately zeroed in on the weak point in his argument.
    - to aim a gun or other weapon towards something or someone
- 20. He always *had an eye for* the ladies.
  - ♦ have your eye on sth

to want something that you think might become available EX:He has his eye on the bigger apartment next door. 21. It was a *tempestuous romance* with a very ugly breakup. ♦ *tempestuous*: a tempestuous relationship or period of time involves a lot of difficulty and strong emotions

- 7. We don't have time for smiley faces from your married *paramour*.
  - ♦ Paramour = a woman's lover
- 8. I keep buying you robes, but you never get the hint.
- 9. The idea of his friends *gawk*ing over it
  - ♦ To gawk = to stare = to look at something for a long time, in a way that looks stupid
- 10. If word gets out, I'll be a laughing stock...
- 11. Apparently he had a reputation as a ladies' man.
- 12. You're one to talk.
- 13. Thanks for the **heads-up.** = information or warning
- 14. Your derelict ironing has ruined my very favorite blouse..= your terrible ironing ruined it
- 15. I am **whisking** you **away** to the other side of the world
  - whisk sb/sth away/off =to take someone or something quickly away from a place

#### 16. Don't sweat it

- ♦ (AmE spoken) used to tell someone not to worry about something
- 17. I don't ever want you to feel demeaned.
  - ♦ **Demeaned = degraded =** reduce in worth or character
- 18. I assume neither of you would want your tawdry affair to be public knowledge. =
- 19. she'll fire you *on the spot*.
  - On the spot = immediately, often without thinking about it very carefully
- 20. You seem to be in a bit of a bind
  - ♦ Bind= an annoying or difficult situation

- 21. Sounded positively scathing
  - a scathing remark criticizes someone or something very severely scathing attack/remark/comment
- 22. Let's crank up the intensity a bit.= make it more intense
  - ◆ Crank up = to make the sound of something, especially music, louder
- 23. I will see you when I see you

**♦** 

- 24. I could wring your neck = twist
  - ♦ I'll wring sb's neck

spoken used when you are very angry with someone

EX: I'll wring her neck when I get hold of her!

#### 25. Cold Turkey

 an unpleasant physical condition suffered by people who stop taking a drug that they are addicted to

EX: addicts who are made to **go cold turkey** 

- 26. why you're loitering at my front door like a vagabond
  - vagabond = a wanderer who has no established residence or visible means of support
- 27. **Stop selling yourself short =** don't underestimate yourself
- 28. I have had an epiphany
  - Epiphany=a moment when you suddenly realize or understand something important
- 29. From now on, you can get your jollies however you please. = enjoy yourself

Put sth on hold

On hold = in a state or period of indefinite suspension <put our plans on hold>

6. You've given me a lot to chew on.

To Chew on = ponder/to think about

7. So are you two an item now?

be an item =

if two people are an item, they are having a romantic or sexual relationship

- 8. That's water under the bridge.
- 9. Their marriage is on the rocks.

on the rocks

in or into a state of destruction or wreckage <their marriage is on the rocks>

10. It's so nice of you to take me out for a **swanky** lunch.

Swanky= very fashionable and expensive

### 11. She needs her space

### 12. You give her an inch, she'll take a mile.

Be generous to someone and the person will demand even more

## 13. You are holding the purse strings.

Hold the purse strings = refer to the control of spending in a family, company, country

### 14. That's what separates them from the nobodies.

### 15. Needs some minor touch-ups

Touch-ups= alterations so as to produce a more desirable appearance

## 16. Before we adopted her, she went through some trying times

Trying time- annoying/difficult time

#### 17. Let's not **stir things up** for her

stir up [stir sb/sth⇔up] phr v

to deliberately try to cause arguments or bad feelings between people

#### 18. keep calm and take the high road

take the (moral) high road

to do what you believe is right according to your beliefs

### 19. I'm waiting for the other shoe to drop

to wait for the inevitable next step or the final conclusion

### 20. what is he bringing to the table?

on the table

an offer, idea etc that is on the table has been officially suggested and someone is considering it

Run wild=act unruly

11. you might have **PTSD** 

**PTSD**= post-traumatic stress disorder= disorder characterized by illusions that a past traumatic event is recurring

- 12. she's in *over her head*= it's beyond her ability to understand
- 13. way to go = congratulations/ good for you
- 14. Don't kill it = don't ruin this special moment
- 15. I can just pick up where we left off = continue from where we stopped
- 16. I'll give you *a killer recommendation*. = excellent
- 17. He and I got off to a rocky start.= did not begin well
- 18. That looks positively *succulent*.

Succulent /'sʌkjʊlənt/ = juicy and good to eat

- 19. I don't want to spoil my appetite.= ruin it
- ماست مالی = 20. I don't cut corners

Cut corners = do sth the cheapest/easiest way

21. scare up some chocolate milk

**scare up** [scare up sth] *phr v* 

to make something although you have very few things to make it from

- Let me see if I can scare up something for you to eat.
- 22. Jacklyn **bought** our story= believe the story
- 23. we're in the clean= have no more secrets
- 24. make this one count= cause sth be in its best and most effective way
- 25. I was parched= extremely thirsty
- 26. She is finally getting a taste of her own medicine
  - = experience sth bad that she's been doing to others
- 27. you'd leap at the chance to ...

#### leap at the chance/opportunity

to accept an opportunity very eagerly

- I leapt at the chance of studying art in Paris.
- 28. he's growing on me= I'm starting to like him
- 29. Her album drops next week.= will be released
- 30. a big sensation = a big excitement
- 31. I just wanna give a **shout out** to her

  Shout out =a public expression of thanks or gratitude
- 32. I was using alcohol as a **crutch** = راه فرار support
- 33. that's the **silver lining** = the positive aspect of a difficult experience
- 34. That's **ludicrous**= ridiculous.
- 35. it'll be a cold day in hell = highly unlikely
- 36. She's **certifiable** = fit to be certified as an insane person

#### **Sugar Mama**

A woman (often an older woman) who holds her man/woman in nice standing with money, food, an apartment, etc. -- not always used in a derogatory fashion,

EX: "Why can't I find me a nice sugar mama to take care of me?"

- 10. He's trying to weasel his way back into your life. = gradually become dear to you
- 11. let me save you the trouble= make it easier for you
- 12. to pin a murder on sb = blame/accuse sb of murder
- 13. He always had a **soft spot** for her when she's in distress

  Soft spot= a sentimental affection
- 14. If I got cancer, I'd **milk** it

  to milk sth/sb for sth = get money/advantage of a situation in an dishonest way
- 15. She's handing out money left and right.
- 16. I am not getting in the middle. = interfere, or get caught between two people
- 17. you're trying to win me back. = make me like you again
- 18. I am not gonn a *sit around on the sidelines* anymore = \*\*stand/stay/remain/sit on the sidelines\* = not taking part in this although you have to
- 19. Disneyland was an absolute hoot= very funny and amusing

20. You seem to be in a more *sour mood* than usual

**sour mood** = bad-tempered/ unfriendly mood

21. You did not just **shush** me

Shush= tell sb to be quiet

- 22. He loves me with every fiber of his being. = totally
- 23. That mass-produced piece of junk = low quality
- 24. a stupid **thug** = اوباش, hooligan thug= a violent man
- 25. **kudos** to you= bravo
- 26. you **topped** yourself = did your best performance
- 27. tattle on me to him = gossip about me
- 28. I'm gonna go out on a limb and say she is crazy.

#### out on a limb

alone and without help or support

- \*All the other countries signed the agreement, leaving Britain out on a limb.
- He'd **gone out on a limb** (=taken a risk) to help us.
- 29. The plan is on. = the plan begins
