Some people think that parents should teach children how to be good members of society. Others however believe that school is the place to learn this.

Upbringing a child to be a merit member of society is a process which proceeds from childhood to adulthood. There are plenty of skills which one person shall be taught, such as respecting the law, having social skills and being moral.
