In recent years some countries have experienced very rapid economic development. This has resulted in much higher standards of living in urban areas but not in the countryside. This situation may bring some problems for the country as a whole. What are these problems? How might they be reduced?

Nowadays, one of the major <u>difficulty</u> that many developed cities are struggling with is the high rate of immigration to urban cities. In fact this issue has had some destructive consequences on the people's lifestyles. According to the latest statistical article published by the Research Center of Tehran University (R.C.T.U), more than 80 percent of people <u>who</u> live in the rural areas have left their houses to enjoy the facilities in the big cities. Now, having considered the importance of the issue and how destructive it could be for the urban planning a question arises as to what are the influential factors <u>in to</u> restrict<u>ing</u> this high rate of immigration?

First of all, a majority of people believe it is as important to provide different facilities in the countryside sides as to improve only the urban cities. In fact it would be quite vital for

people who live in the outskirts to have access to facilities such as universities, hospitals, and sport clubs and so on to enjoy a higher standard of living and feel interested in to their own areas. In this way, they would no longer leave the peace and contentment of the countryies to experience the hectic life of the cities.

Secondly, with the passage of time as the time passed, although immigrants would enjoy some facilities, the cities would may get more crowded and polluted to the extent that the quality of life would be extensively decreased. Take some metropolitan cities like Tehran as an example, people always get stuck in heavy traffic even for going to a short distances, so . So they feel down and depressed as a result of noise or weather pollutions and other byproducts of overpopulation like poverty, addiction, unemployment.,...

Considering this issue from different aspects ad dimensions, I get the impression that it would be essential to encourage people to not leave the countryside sides by implementing some effective measures and enhancinge the quality of life there.

What it all comes down to is that the high rate of immigration from rural areas to the cities could cause some troubles for both the cities and people involved. Encouraging them to stay there and enjoy the peace and contentment of the nature would be by possible by planning and making make people interested in to their own areas.
